PE and Sports at Greengate Lane Academy



At Greengate lane Academy we aim to ensure:-

- All pupils have access to high quality PE lessons to develop fitness, stamina, health and well-being.
- Pupils have the opportunity to participate in sport beyond the curriculum.
- Our curriculum offers opportunities for pupils to develop the knowledge and understanding of what makes a healthy lifestyle.
- We forge links with the local community to enrich the PE provision within school.
- All pupils have the opportunity to take part in festivals and competitions at Trust and City level
- Children enjoy sport and physical activity.
- We aim for all children to represent the school at some external event which could include sporting competitions

High Quality PE

We have a wide range of sporting activities at Greengate Lane Academy to enhance and enrich our PE curriculum. Some of these are funded through the use of the Sport's Premium and others are funded from School Funds.

- All pupils have PE Lessons in school. These cover the whole range of subjects – movement, fitness, gymnastics, dance, games, athletics, swimming, etc.
- Swimming takes place in Y4 for all pupils.
- We are also enabling those Y5 children who did not attain the 25m target distance to have top up lessons
- After-school and lunchtime clubs take place throughout the year with coaches for a range of sports. These are free to all pupils. A list of clubs is published in our school newsletter.
- We employ a specialist sports coach to ensure high quality
- We engage with additional coaches for specialist subjects and sports. Rugby, cricket, handball, basketball etc
- Teachers work alongside these coaches for their own CPD.
- We have a comprehensive yearly overview of events so that we can raise children's skill level in order to be competitive.

- We have set up a new network so that we can play competitive football matches with other schools.
- We hold an annual Fun Run which raises money for charity and the school. Parents and members of the community are invited to watch and take part.
- Children have the opportunity to take part in more unusual sports e.g. Judo and Handball.
- We provide specialist kit and equipment for children playing in tournaments.
- Representing Greengate Lane Academy (being an Ambassador) in a sport is fundamental to our school ethos and is an important aspect of our Astrea Dispositions.
- We are working with “Sports for Champions” with an Aspiring Olympic athlete (Beth Dobbin ,GB 200m champion) to Raise Aspiration, Increase Participation and skill acquisition over the year.
- We CELEBRATE Progress, Effort and Successes equally in terms of our Sporting and PE Outcomes

PE Kit.

Pupils are expected to change into PE kit for their PE Lessons. They are not permitted to wear PE clothing underneath their normal clothes. All jewellery and watches should be removed for reasons of safety.

Standard P.E. Kit consists of:-

- White T-Shirt.
- Dark Shorts.

For indoor PE or Dance in addition to the standard P.E. Kit above

- Bare Feet, Plimsolls or Gym shoes.

For outdoor PE or Games in addition to the standard P.E. Kit above

- Trainers (these must be different from normal day wear)
- Tracksuit or sweatshirt for outdoor cold weather activities (optional).
